- 43.6% students enrolled at UniSC are first in family to attend university

- UniSC provides scholarships across a range of areas including:

### SDG 5: Gender equality

### SDG 6: Clean water and sanitation

- 50.2% water from recycled sources
- All UniSC campuses are Water Refill Campuses.
  The University does not sell any single use plastic water bottles either directly or through its vendors
- UniSC became the first university in Australia to supplement 'make-up' water for the 50-metre Olympic swimming pool with treated onsite lake water
- Environmentally-friendly and non-toxic e-water cleaning solutions are used in the cleaning regime at UniSC to replace the use of commercial cleaning chemicals

## SDG 7: Affordable and clean energy

- UniSC has approximately 6,500 solar panels that power a "water battery" that cuts our energy use by 33%
- 3,173,828 kWh renewable energy used at UniSC Sippy Downs
- 2,952 tonnes CO2-e (emissions) avoided which translates to a 33% energy saving at UniSC Sippy Downs



### SDG 8: Decent work and economic growth

- UniSC has an Anti-Discrimination and Freedom from Bullying and Harassment governing policy
- UniSC has an Enterprise Agreement pursuant to section 172 of the Fair Work Act 2009.
   The agreement is negotiated between the National Tertiary Education Industry Union (NTEU) and the ASU Together branch.
- UniSC has a flexible working arrangement and working from home guidelines
- UniSC degrees have the opportunity for Work Integrated Learning (internship, placement, practicum and field experience etc)

- UniSC has a student admissions policy which is non-discriminatory
- UniSC has an Anti-Discrimination and Freedom from Bullying and Harassment governing policy
- UniSC has a governing policy on Equity, Diversity and Inclusion and developed a Diversity and Inclusion Plan 2021–2023. The Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Committee promote the principles of the governing policy and plan.
- UniSC is proud of its Reconciliation Charter and the Vice-Chancellor's Indigenous Advisory Committee. It has created the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Employment and Career Development Strategy 2021-2024.
- The Disability Access and Inclusion Plan 2021-2024 demonstrates our ongoing commitment to creating an equitable, accessible, and inclusive environment for all students, staff and the wider university community
- UniSC's AccessAbility Services ensures equal access to all aspects of university life

# SDG 12: Responsible consumption and production

- 54% waste diverted from landfill
- 32 tonnes organic waste composted
- UniSC participates in Containers for Change for community recycling
- UniSC has a policy on **ethical sourcing** of food and supplies
- The University's on-site composting apparatus
  (OSCA) composting machine transforms
  organic waste into nutrient-rich
  compost for the campus gardens
- UniSC Print Services are committed to use sustainable paper and processes
- UniSC has adopted a new policy to purchase hybrid fleet vehicles



### SDG 13: Climate action

- 2,952 tonnes CO2-e (emissions) avoided which translates to a 33% energy saving at UniSC
- UniSC's Carbon Management Plan (CMP) is the roadmap to becoming zero net carbon

- Host of the Pumicestone Catchment Convergence, 3-day conference on local water and land conservation issues for the Sunshine Coast


