Principal Activities

The University of the Sunshine Coast was established under *The Sunshine Coast University College Act 1994* and officially opened in 1996. Full university powers were granted to the University under the *University of the Sunshine Coast Act 1998*.

The main functions of the University as set out in the Act are:

- · to provide education at university standard; and
- · to provide facilities for, and encourage, study and research; and
- to encourage the advancement and development of knowledge, and its application to government, industry, commerce and the community; and
- to provide courses of study or instruction, at the levels of achievement the council considers appropriate, to meet the needs of the community; and
- to confer higher education awards; and
- · to disseminate knowledge and promote scholarship; and
- to provide facilities and resources for the wellbeing of the university's staff, students and other persons
 undertaking courses at the university; and
- to exploit commercially, for the university's benefit, a facility or resource of the university, including, for
 example, study, research or knowledge, or the practical application of study, research or knowledge,
 belonging to the university, whether alone or with someone else; and
- . to perform other functions given to the university under this Act or another Act.

There were no significant changes in the nature of the activities of the University during the year.

Strategic Directions

The Strategic Plan is the University's highest level planning document, along with the Master Plan. The current planning process was initiated in 2004 by the University Council, which developed a detailed environmental (SWOT) analysis and identified the directions for the consultative process to follow. At various stages throughout the process, the University's Senior Management Team provided input and critique, fine tuning each draft until the final version was developed through the Office of the Vice-Chancellor.

Mission

To be the major catalyst for the innovative and sustainable economic, cultural and educational advancement of the region, through the pursuit of international standards in teaching, research and engagement.

Values

In the pursuit of its Mission and its everyday operations, the University has a commitment to:

Review of Operations

All Australian universities are currently being audited for quality and accountability by Australian Universities Quality Agency (AUQA). Each audit covers all areas of University operations. The University chose to undertake a trial audit in March 2006, in preparation for the University of the Sunshine Coast's first AUQA audit in October 2006. A review of the operations of the University of the Sunshine Coast during the year, including the results of the AUQA audit is provided in detail in the full version of the 2006 Annual Report.

Significant Changes in the State of Affairs

During the year there were no significant changes in the state of the affairs of the University other than that referred to in the annual report.

Matters Subsequent to the End of the Financial Year

No matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the University or the consolidated entity, the results of those operations or the state of affairs of the University in future financial years.

It is likely that Multi Access Productions Pty Ltd, a subsidiary, will not continue operations in 2007. The going concern of Multi Access Productions Pty Ltd will not have a significant impact on the University or the consolidated entity.

Likely Developments and Expected Results of Operations

Disclosure of information regarding likely developments, future prospects and business strategies of the operations of the University in future financial years and the expected results of those operations is likely to result in unreasonable prejudice to the University. Accordingly, this information has not been disclosed in this report.

Environmental Regulation

The University's operations are not regulated by any significant environmental regulation under a law of the Commonwealth or a State or Territory.

Insurance of Officers

In 2006, the University of the Sunshine Coast held comprehensive insurance policies in relation to Directors and Officers.

The annual premium of \$10,512 for Directors and Officers Insurance covered the period 1 November 2005 to 1 November 2006.

There are no significant legal matters other than those referred to in the financial statements and notes following.
