THE FOCUS ON COUNTRY



Drawing on the diversity of the Mooloolah River National Park and the originally translocated vegetation from Brightwater, the planting palette looks to complement and expand on the local ecosystems. The palette creates the initial framework for future revegetation and landscape projects within areas around and to the south east of the water bodies. Species have been coordinated with production lists of local nurseries.

THE WOODLAND


The Northern Frame is the high ground which captures the sports precinct, Sippy Downs Drive frontage and surrounding landscape north of the two water bodies. Typically dryer and harsher growing conditions, the planting palette contains hardier species which offer amenity, habitat and connections back to ancient landscapes while being appropriate for this modern and functional precinct.
